

Our chairman DAVID BROWN has been honoured with another accolade this time by being made a Life Member of Sale Harriers Manchester. This exceptional tribute follows a litany of previous commendations whilst he worked as one of GMP's most successful detectives and culminated in being awarded the CBE (Commander of the British Empire) by the Queen before his retirement as Head of GMP's Serious and Organised Crime Unit.

David's involvement with Sale Harriers Manchester began with the younger athletes of the Primary Section. Being a Level 3 Coach and lead coach for the Yellow Group at Crossford Bridge, he has for years been developing the athletic potential of our youngest hopefuls. During those years he has also been heavily involved in the Annual Awards night for the Primary Section and it was he who had the insight to hold an annual Open Meeting at Sportcity in order that Crossford Bridge's young athletes could 'try their hand' utilising a top quality facility.

He has been very involved in the Club's Executive Committee for many years most recently being elected its Chairman and has used his immense experience to keep the club keep up to date with current athletic issues and he further took on the task of updating the Club's Constitution.

Using his vast experience as a policeman, David pioneered the Club's Criminal Record Bureau checks for all adults involved with younger club members and so successful was this pilot that the model was rolled out nationally and led to David being appointed by UK Athletics as the lead Officer for CRB checks for all coaches and officials in the country.

When the Crossford Bridge Management Group was formed some years ago, David's role in the group involved managing the whole site incorporating the football pitches, together with the athletic facility. He did this with distinction despite the great challenges he encountered and always with SHM at heart.



David is particularly renowned as an Official Race Starter. This began firstly at local meetings at Crossford Bridge and led to him officiating at International events that incorporated duties such as Technical Director and Meeting Manager. He is as available for local club T & F, road and crosscountry events as being a Chief Starter at major domestic and international events.

David's contribution to Sale Harriers Manchester is outstanding and the club congratulates him on being made a Life Member.





# nchester area Cross-country league Fechin McCormick manchester area



The Manchester Area Cross-Country league came about as the result of a merger in 2006/7 of the Manchester & District Cross-Country League; the North-West Women's League and the Cheshire League. This new league delivers five matches through the winter across the region's public parks meant to provide competition and endurance training for the region's runners. Anybody can

The first match traditionally begins on the rolling undulations of Heaton Park (October). It was then onto muddier Boggart Hole Clough (November) and Sherdley Park (December) will be remembered for torrential rain and slushy mud. January saw the caravan move to

> Woodbank Park and another wintry day and, finally, on a crisp, sunny February on home territory Wythenshawe Park the League came to a close.

What's significant about this year's results is the extent to which individuals and sections did not avail of the league's opportunity for tough competition, training and, also important, profiling the club at its very best. Others might also expect this as a large club!

#### SENION MEN

The senior men have dominated this league as title holders for five times of the past seven years but this year they were relegated to third behind Trafford AC, who dominated throughout the winter, and runners-up, Stockport AC. There was a commendable response from mainstream club members - between eleven and sixteen for each match, but not from our front runners! Apart from STEFFAN NORTH (who brilliantly won one match and came second in two more) and JAMES BAILEY (who ran one race at Woodbank Park), CHRIS HEYS was our second counter in four of the matches and our first counter at Wythenshawe Park! Following him was newcomer RICHARD WATSON (for three matches) and behind him we relied heavily on club vets to finish a team! Well done to stalwart CHRIS HEYS who has been running better than ever and who, with PAUL BARRETT and ELTON DAVIES, were the only three to complete at least four of the five matches and feature in the overall league rankings finishing 4th, 11th & 13th respectively - well done!

The veteran men finished 7th from nine finishing teams – a slight improvement on last year's 8th place! FECHIN McCORMICK (3 matches), newcomer STEFAN SCHUMACHER (3 matches), durable BILL FOX (2 matches), hard-working JOHN BATTERSBY (2 matches) and the sprightliest of the pack - GARY ROWLINSON, IAN WEATHERALL, NICK PEACH, FRANK CORDINGLEY and ANDY YATES who all raced once.

#### **UNDER 15 BOYS**

As with the under-15 girls, the under 15-boys have not been out of the top two places for almost a decade (apart from in 2003/4 when they failed to complete a team!). This year they kept that record by becoming the runners-up behind St.Helen's AC who won the title for the first time. Behind this achievement was a group of 5 dedicated cross-country runners this winter. BEN YATES was the first to cross the line for the club in two races and third club counter in three more; CALLUM ROWLINSON was the club's first counter for one; second for two; third in one and 5th counter at Wythenshawe Park. Consequently, both these lads ranked highly in the overall league rankings. CHRIS BUTT was second home for the club in one race and fourth counter in two more; CALLUM GREENWOOD was first counter in one race and second counter twice more so all this group had their stake in the team's success. With GLYNN WINDEBANK all also had a great winter.

One final notice! Newcomer CHARLIE HULSON, who'd runnas a guest at Heaton Park, toed the line for the club in the final Wythenshawe Park match ...and won! Watch out for this young lad next year!

#### **UNDER 17 BOYS**

The most consistently successful team this winter has been the under-17 lads. Coached by one of the country's most successful runners of the 1990's, PAUL RODEN honed them to an easy title. This section has now won every league title since 1999 – apart from last year when they failed to complete a team. 

Training hard for the London Marathon, she showed all of her former ability and with strong consistent running finished 12th.









For the sixth consecutive Championship, club Chairman DAVID BROWN, resplendent as ever as Chief Starter in his blood-red regalia, called 'curtains up' on ten thrilling running acts whilst wife **CAROLE** was backstage among the Finish Line Judges. Spectators were encamped within the shadow of Jimmy Seville's Leeds penthouse.. To the sound of the Starter's gun the day's drama began..





BRIGIT COOKE followed two places later! Though frustrated to get exactly the same 14th position as last year, considering setbacks that included a low iron count and being in France until mid-October, this was certainly a solid run and a promising preparation for her BUSA

Championships the following weekend.

JENNA HILL had also hoped to improve on last year but was only two places better in 37th. She's much fitter, stronger and faster than ever and, as essentially a track runner, she may have expected too much over a very tough course even with her admirable determined attitude.

Likewise, RUTH WATSON is 800m specialist who found it tough. Following several emotional weeks dealing with personal & family issues, she was justifiably pleased just to be the 4th team counter

This quartet finished 5th - the section's best position since 2004 when they won silver medals.

Next home was Oxford post-graduate RACHEL DEEGAN whose 57th place she regarded as an encouraging stepping stone towards a long awaited return to the track.

The remainder of the squad – one of the largest to turn out for a Northern X.C Championship, is a promising Crossford Bridge group for whom this Championship was their debut 'Northern'. Impressive mid-field packing confirmed this group could be a formidable team on the roads this summer. Watch out for them - they're chapping at the bit and all thoroughly enjoyed the day: JENNY BOWMAN, JACKIE CORDINGLEY, VICKY CORDINGLEY, JOANNE STREET, ALISON PYE. JAN NICHOLLS, and CATRIN EVANS, (ehmmmm!) LINDA ROWLINSON and JENNY CLINK.

## U/15 BOYS

Newcomer CHARLIE HULSON (Welcome!) was the main star of this age-group. Surprising everyone (except his family & coach), he won the bronze medal and came within a

whisker of the silver and only nine seconds from the gold. Watch out for this young lad with a fantastic pedigree - already a Welsh International and the Welsh Cross-Country Champion!

CALLUM ROWLINSON, a member of one of the Club's popular running families, was the only other club representative. He finished a below par 143rd.

### U/15 GIRLS Champions

By this time in the afternoon Roundhey Park is a buzz with a Festival of running rarely experienced, reinforced by the hundreds of senior men, friends, families and supporters now arrived for the day's piece de la resistance - the senior men's race,. It was within this sense of anticipation that the U/15 girls lined up to DAVID BROWN' starting pistol.

Last year's Champion and 2006 U/13 Champion, SARAH BARKER, Britain's fine young champion runner (and swimmer) who heads the UK rankings and who has had an unfortunate year blighted by injury, was immediately to the fore. With the effects of illness well documented, she ran out of fuel in the second half, fell back and bravely finished 5th. She led the U/15 girls to the Championship title and the section's best result for a decade, making it one of the day's highpoints.

Newcomer HANNAH DOHERTY was just behind her and showed all of Sarah's potential. Welcome, Hannah! She currently ranks 6th in UK Britain for 3000m.

TYRA WATSON was next home in 14th place. A track specialist, whatever little cross-country she does it's usually to build stamina. Coached by Peter Shaw, she's been doing indoors this winter & has clocked 41.7 for 300m & 97 for 600m - some shifting for a 14-year old.

Running is just one of many disciplines for Modern Pentathlon specialist ALICE FITTON. Missing the start and having to catch up from the back of the field may have been useful training for a pentathlete, but for this extremely talented

sportsperson it meant finishing 42nd rather than among the top 10. Her run still merited her 4th team counter and a team gold medal.

AISLING TOAL showed how well she's improving; newcomer JULIE GUINNANE who's hardly run any cross-country this winter, showed how useful she could be and friends **BEATRICE CORDINGLEY** and JEMMA NEVIN presented themselves very well with two very solid runs.

#### SENIOR MFN

Now! The main drama of the day! Our senior men tend to put their 'eggs' into this major 'basket' rather than into autumn crosscountry leagues and relays. This strategy has paid off for they've been rarely out of the top three in a decade. However, having finished runners-up three times to five times champions Leeds City AC, could their 'eggs' this year produce the dream 'golden goose' of beating Leeds for the title - on their territory?

It all looked good in the early stages! This year's National X.C. Championships - the pinnacle of the cross-country season, were held at Alton Towers within sight of Britain's best loved theme park. The fast downhill start and undulations did not unleash the torrent of fear of the nearby rollercoaster rides but the course certainly provided adrenaline pumping, heart pounding rides that tested the true grit of England's best in every age-group, assembled from Elswick to Ealing.

An overview of club performances reveal that, although we did better than last year when we failed to finish teams in seven of the ten age-groups, this year again we failed to complete an U/13 boy's or U/13 girls' team, an U/15 boy's team and no U/17 & U/20 girls teams! By contrast, it merits discussion why a large club like ours within a vast conurbation must envy Aldershot, Farnham & District AC's who. again this year, won an incredible seven of the ten available titles and were runnersup in a further two with several individual medallists.

As we bring athletes to the start line we again acknowledge the contribution DAVID & CAROL BROWN, our club chairman & club secretary. On this occasion they were armed with walkie-talkies as course marshals rather than the usual starter's pistol & finish clip-board.

#### U/15 GIRLS

Our under-15 airls finished 11th from thirty-five completing teams. This is a performance generally consistent with the past and an improvement on last year when the section did not complete a team. Britain's top runners, newcomer HANNAH DOHERTY and SARAH BARKER made all the difference with Hannah finishing 20th and Sarah, recovering after illness, in 34th place. Our chance of medals disappeared when TYRA WATSON was competing in the National Indoor 800m and ALICE FITTON had international obligations. Well done also to **AISLING TOAL and JODIE GUINNANE** who were the all-important follow up counters and to SAM MOHTASHAM who flew the flag with a good run.

#### SENIOR WOMEN

Inevitably, the senior women's event is a 'who's who' of Britain's elite and mixing it among them at the sharp end was, again, our own SONIA THOMAS. As a former double Northern senior cross-country champion and U/17 & U/20 Northern champion, Sonia's pedigree is unquestioned and she showed this again with a superb 8th place, the same as in 2001 - a tribute to her durability. She led the team to an uncharacteristic 14th place! Mainly due to last minute withdrawals by BRIGIT COOKE, MAURA PRENDIVILLE and RACHEL DEEGAN through illness,

Brigit in particular was extremely disappointed and had worked hard to get in trim for this National.

Relative youngsters and track specialists JENNA HILL & RUTH WATSON, the core of the Northern X.C team, were, therefore, again the team stalwarts and crossed the line second and third counters, as ever with 110% commitment.

Well-done to JO STREET who, despite nursing an injury, turned out to ensure the club finished a team - excellent preparation for the looming London Marathon assuming full recovery from injury!

Team manager, ALISON PYE as always 'hands-on', felt her squad's pain with a solid run that's excellent preparation for watch out - good summer road races!

#### U/17 BOYS

With no team last year; 15th the previous year, this year's 9th place is another encouraging result for this squad that have notched up the Northern silver medal and the MACCL title this winter. They would have been several positions higher (and ahead of Warrington AC & Trafford AC in the published results!!) had it not been for the misfortune of RYAN WORLAND losing his electronic timing tag where the rules state he couldn't be included in the results. It's a shame for Ryan's 115th place was a tremendous improvement on previous years. As on every previous occasion, the team were led home by steam-train NIALL BROOKE

(21st) followed, as invariably was the case throughout the winter, by JAMIE RODEN and then the familiar solid procession of ALEX WEBSTER, JAMES WIGNALL, ALEX LETT and DANNY HOPE. Well done to all of them!

#### U/20 MEN

For the second successive year our junior men finished last - an unenviable record! Apart from DAVID HOWLETT, all were victims to lack of training - a possible consequence of modern day University life! Last year David was the last of the six-man squad in 120th place. This year he was the first home in 125th place whilst his peers from last year were each some fifty places lower than last year! Too much socializing, lads - get training! In the past, this all-important section was often in the medals.

#### SENIOR MEN

Following with similar strong runs to last year were SIMON MILLS (47th) and STEFFAN NORTH (53rd); MATT BOND (78th), currently living in Bulgaria, improved 15 places (about one minute) on last year; JAMES BAILEY (105th) had his best ever injury-free winter and CHRIS HEYS (155th), who'd not been a team counter at a Northern or National before, explained his best ever position "My aim was to make the top 150! Compared to last year my percentage position was improved from 19.98% to 12.46%. Also I was 4:53 behind the winner instead of 6:06 last year"

RICHARD WATSON, COLIN GELL and PAUL BARRETT were also well up in what must be the toughest race in Britain. Our final finisher in 792nd place was STEVE JONES. Well done, Steve!

### U/15 BOYS



# WORLD TRIALS & UK CHAMPIONSHIPS Fechin McCormick

The Norwich Union World Trials & UK Championships, held at the EIS Sheffield in February, was two days of quality competition for Britain's top athletes. The meeting decided the national champions in each event and the opportunity for Britain's hopefuls to have the chance to book their places to the World Indoor Athletics Championships at Valencia (March). The first past the post in each event was guaranteed selection providing they had the gualifying standard.

KATE DENNISON (Pole Vault): It was a comprehensive victory for Kate with a first time clearance over 4.25m that booked her ticket to the World Indoor Championships. Kate has repeatedly won every major pole vault domestic competition and represented GB in World, European and Commonwealth Games.

SARA McGREAVY (60m Hurdles) lost out to Sarah Claxton (Woodford Green) only on the last flight of hurdles. Her silver medal in 8.18 was a season's best. Sarah has represented GB in World & European Junior Indoor & Outdoor Championships.

ROB MITCHELL (High Jump): Our Commonwealth Games high jump representative & multiple Welsh champion was 4th with a jump of 2.19m

MARK CHRISTIE (Pole vault): Following his Northern indoor title Mark jumped brilliantly for a fantastic new PB of 5.16m and the bronze medal.

GLEN COMISH (3000k): Last year's 3k northern indoor champion and one of the club's elite sub-30 10k roadsters was 5th in a season's best 8.24.66 one week after clocking 24.17 in the classy but windy Alsager '5'.

KIERAN KELLY (Shot): Following a superb PB of 18.20m at the Irish Indoor championships two weeks earlier Britain's No.4 shot putter had hoped for better than 17.83m and 4th place.

RIMANTAS MARTISAUSKAS (Shot): Our Lithunian Yorkshire man who has represented us in European competition didn't quite throw as far as his Northern indoor silver medal.

REBECCA PEAKE (Shot). As with Kieran, following an indoor PB of 15.91m to win the Irish Indoor Championships to improve her to 2nd in the UK rankings, she'd hoped for better than the silver medal in 15.67.

ABIGAIL HEYWOOD (Pole Vault): Under-20 Abigail may have finished a lowly 7th but Britain's No.3 U/20 pole vaulter has every reason to be delighted with a superb PN of 3.70m.

TATUM NELSON (400m) Had Tatum produced the 54.52 time she produced at the Midland Indoor Championships the following weekend, she won have won the silver medal - instead of 5th place in 56.41.

STEPHANIE PYWELL (High Jump): Stephanie produced a brilliant PB of 1.85 for the silver medal behind the famous Jessica Ennis (Sheffield).

DEBO ADEMUYEWO (400m): This was an even better performance than at the Welsh Indoors where he won

As ever, many of our club athletes, several at the top of their disciplines, excelled and returned home with a total haul of 15 gold medals, 7 silver and 5 bronze medals.

#### MARK CHRISTIE **SENIOR POLE VAULT GOLD 5.00m**

#### ROB MITCHELL **SENIOR HIGH JUMP GOLD 2.15m**

One of the unquestionable highlights of this year's Northern championships was this high jump competition! Our Welsh National High Jump record holder and Melbourne Commonwealth Games finalist, though he did not jump as high as when he won silver at last year's Championships, showed he's well on his way back to the top. He proved it the following week when he leapt even higher to retain his Welsh Senior Indoor title and then went on to finish 4th at the UK Championships & NU World Trials.

#### **REBECCA SWEENEY**

#### **SENIOR 400m GOLD 56.68** SENIOR 800m BRONZE 2:13.85

One of Britain's top 400m specialists for many years, Rebecca retained her Northern title in a time slightly slower than last year. However, she improved further to 56.25 at the UK Trials two weeks later. Her 800m indoors was a career first, thought she had tried this longer distance outdoors towards the end of 2007. She improved by three seconds to 2:10.12 the following week at the UKA Indoors Challenge semi-final at Sportcity.

#### RIMANTAS **MARTISAUSKAS**

#### **SENIOR SHOT PUTT SILVER 16.80m**

Known as 'Rimas', he is now a first claim member having been a higher competition athlete with the club last year. He is Lithuanian but has been living in Yorkshire for the past few years and competed at the European U23s last season, missing out on the final. His performance wasn't a PB, as he has thrown well over 17m in the past.

#### HELEN TAYLOR SENIOR 200m

## **SILVER 25.33**

In her first track competition this year, Helen retained her indoors silver medal from last year. Again, she has been a valuable team member outdoors contributing to the senior women's national success over the years.

#### JACOB BROWN **SENIOR LONG JUMP** SILVER 7.20m

Last year's Champion will be greatly consoled that his silver medal was a great PB and improvement on last year's gold medal jump. This is his 4th Northern Indoor medal in either the Long Jump or Triple Jump. It's also raised him to 12th in the UK rankings.

#### MATT CULLEN **SENIOR POLE VAULT** SILVER 4.00M

Decathlete Matt added this Northern senior silver to the NoEAA pole vault silver medal he won in 2006. Where do these combined events athletes get their energy? In the week prior to this Championship Matt took part in the England Athletics Indoor Combined Events Championships also at the EIS, Sheffield where, among the five disciplines, he recorded a pole vault PB of 4.30m

#### JENNA HILL SENIOR 1500m **BRONZE 4.42.97**

Jenna's enthusiasm and new-found running confidence has resulted in competing indoors this winter. In a very tactical race, she was especially pleased to sneak the bronze medal From there, she competed again over 1500m at the UK Indoor Championships two weeks later against some of the best girls in the country and, in another tactical race, improved by a further three seconds.

#### NICK SAMUELS SENIOR 3000m 4TH 8:37.90

Nick opted for indoors rather than crosscountry this winter. Essentially an 800/1500m specialist, this indoor 3000m was a first. He went on from there to run two 1500m in the Birmingham Games and then had a real struggle at the UK Championships & NU Trials.

#### DAN AGUSTUS

#### SENIOR 3000m 5th 8:41.85

A specialist on the roads and country and one of the club's elite sub-30 minutes for 10k with 29.54 at the 2006 AAA Championships in Chichester, Dan's shorter races are traditionally 5k or representing the club in road relay championships. This was his debut indoors 3k.

#### ANDY WILKINSON

#### SENIOR 400m 5TH 50.18 SENIOR 200m 4TH 22.58

Last year's title holder wasn't in the same shape this year. He went on from this Championship to compete at the UK Championships two weeks later and would have been similarly disappointment in the 200m to have run his faster time in the heats.

#### KATH WELLAM

#### SENIOR 400m 5TH 61:47 SENIOR 800m 4TH 2:25.08

This was a rare indoor outing for Kath who has represented the club loyally outdoors for several years and continues to do so in the 400m, 400m hurdles and the triple jump. This was also her first encounter with the 800m indoors.

#### **GRACE SMITH** SENIOR 60m HURDLES 5TH 9.01

Grace prepared studiously for this Championship with two 60m races and two 60m hurdles races at the City of Manchester Indoor Open meetings. Her time of 9.01 was her best to date.
















#### ABIGAIL IRO7URU U/20 LONG JUMP GOLD 6.02m

Following her U/20 bronze medal & massive PB in last winter's northern championship, our World Youth representative broke the first of several records smashed over the weekend. In fine form, her PB of

6.02m broke the CBP record and put her top of Britain's U/20 rankings. A week later, she finished second at the UKA Indoor Challenge semi-final and then went on to represent GBR in the Indoors Jump international with the Netherlands in London. She wasn't as snappy as she usually and finished 4th but at this level had invaluable experience.

#### REBEKAH WILSON U/20 60m GOLD 7.64

Rebekah has medalled in every one of her five past Northern Championships! This year she added the U/20 Championship title to the U/17 silver medal she won last year. In the run-up to the Championship, she recorded a PB of 7.59 and a week later, followed with second place in UKA Indoor Challenge semi-finals at Sportcity. Though still only 18 years old, she ranks 4th in the UK U/20 rankings.

#### ROBYN RASHFORD U/20 200m GOLD 24.93

Another of Britain's very talented young sprinters who, though still only 18-years old, already ranks 4th in the UK's U/20 rankings. She launched this winter's indoors in January with a 200m race at the City of Manchester Open Meeting at Sportcity and then improved steadily to win this championship title. She continued to progress to run a season's best of 24.86 at the UKA Indoor challenge semifinal at Sportcity.

#### ANDREW BURGESS U/20 LONG JUMP GOLD 6.85m

This was a tremendous result to please Andy! Ina riveting competition, not only did he achieve the Championship title in a superb last jump and magnificent PB of 6.85m but it propelled him from 23rd to 4th in the UK U/20 rankings and all of this whilst suffering from whiplash! It was also a magnificent improvement from last year's 4th place. He is also the 2006 U/17 long jump indoor silver medallist.

### DARREN HAMMOND

U/20 HIGH JUMP GOLD 2.00m

Following a year of injury Darren still won gold despite having to withdraw with cramp but easily cleared 2m. He was particularly pleased to have won this U/20 title following being 'gutted' last year to have just win silver.



Last year's Championships will remain vivid for Andy for not only did he become the double 60m & 200m champion with two tremendous PB's that resulted in him being selected for his international debut. This year he excelled again in the older U/20 Championships. Opting for only the 60m this time, he again won Gold with another magnificent PB of 6.87.

#### MIKE EHLAN

#### U/20 TRIPLE JUMP GOLD 13.99m

U/20 HIGH JUMP SILVER 1.95m

Last year's Northern U/17 triple jump and high jump Champion has become the U/20 triple Jump champion & high jump silver medallist. In a competition regarded as one of the weekend's highlights, his triple jump was a PB that broke Andrew Sturrocks 2003 CBP record and launched him to 4th in the U/20 UK (despite being still only 17 years old!) & merited him selection for the GBR v NETHERLANDS Indoors jumps International his international debut where he finished a disappointing 6th. Mike's medal tally is now 8 gold, 3 silver and 3 bronze over the past four seasons in the Northern competitions.

#### JAMES WRIGHT U/20 60m HURDLES

Our capable decathlete chose two of his strongest disciplines in which he ranks top 10 in both and was amply rewarded. #### HARRIET PICKLES

#### U/20 TRIPLE JUMP SILVER 11.30m

One of the strongest disciplines for heptathlete Harriet is the triple jump and she currently ranks 11th in the UK U/20 listings despite still being only 18-years old. Her silver medal jump was also a season's best. She is an amazingly versatile and talented athlete who has represented the club well on the highest levels in an amazing range of disciplines - triple jump, shot, sprints, javelin, high jump, 400m hurdles.

#### STEPHEN BUTTERWORTH



What Shaunna achieved in these Championships is simply amazing! On the Saturday she lowered the UK 60m best by 100th of a second. As the previous record was shared by Sarah Wilhelmy (Southend-on-Sea AC) and World Junior 100m champion Vernicha James (Belgrave Harriers), 7.51 seconds in the final was an amazing performance and especially that she had equaled the old CBP of 7.54 in her semi -final.

Then, on the Sunday she lowered the 200m CBP to 24.02 seconds in winning the final – the fourth-fastest time ever in the UK in the age-group – having run a PB of 24.41 in her

heat. Her final time was 0.12sec faster than Amy Spencer (Belgrave Harriers) in 2001, the year she won the World Youth Champs 200m silver medal. "It was a shock" said Shaunna, "I didn't know I had it in me," Coached by Patrick Bell and Bob Gaisie, she said. "In training we've been doing more stamina work, like 300s. I hate doing it but it's working!" Now she's getting down to more work in search of the World Junior Championships 200m qualifying time of 23.95. Her outdoor PB is 24.23 – but she says: "I want to run 23.8 to be sure."

U/17 800m SILVER 2m 13secs

This was a big and exciting lifetime best for Tyra – almost 7 seconds faster than at last year's U/15 NoEAA Championships.

#### JAMES HARDY U/17 LONG JUMP 6th 6m 25cm

James joined last year from Oldham. Coached by Keith Hyunter, he jumped 6m50cm at a February Open meeting at Sportcity

#### PHIL KENNEDY

U/17 HIGH JUMP 8th 1m 89cm

Following his Northern Indoors Gold medal with a season's best by seven seconds, Phil jumped to an even higher PB.

#### ATOLLAH ROSE
