Still on the world stage, we had GEORGIA TAYLOR-BROWN become the World Super-League Triathlon Champion, DAVE PROCTOR the World Masters 1500m Champion, OLIVIA GREEN the World Modern Pentathlon Gold medallist and LOUISE WHITTAKER the World Aquathlon silver medallist.

On the European stage, you'll read that Sale Harriers had six athletes compete in the European Athletic Championships with JONA EFOLOKO again winning relay gold; NIGEL MARTIN won GB Team Gold at the IAU European 50k Championships,

DAVE PROCTOR represented GB Masters in the European Indoor 3000m Championships, OONAGH MCMANUS, still only 12 years old and competing in the U15 age category, represented GB at the European Biathle Championships and won individual bronze and team gold medals. At the same Championships KATHY WELLAM also won L40 silver and GB Relay Silver. Kathy and



MATT BARNES represented GB at the European Age Group Sprint Triathlon Championships with Matt winning the . M45 silver medal.



MEGAN DAVIES WINS £500

MEGAN DAVIES launched her 2022 with a series of great Spring races. At the Podium 5k she produced a huge 34 second PB for a new best of 16.00 minutes and was awarded an equally huge cheque of £500 for first female. Two weeks later she launched her track season at Watford's Open Graded Meeting with a magnificent 3000m PB of 9:09.28 that was a twenty seconds improvement on her best. Just a week after than she made her 5000m debut in Battersee Park with a time of 16:42.54.





MANCHESTER ALIVE WITH MARATHONERS

JONNY MELLOR and BECKY SPRIGGS weren't the only two to run out of the skins in April's Manchester Marathon with commanding wins that smashed the England qualifying standard for the Birmingham Commonwealth Games and European championships but Sale Harriers also had a lot to shout about. As the ultimate test of endurance, everybody's performance is praiseworthy so plaudits go to all twenty-seven . Are you among the most

1. NIGEL MARTIN'S PB of 2:15.19 for 6th place improved his PB by three minutes over last year's Kew Garden's British Olympic Marathon. He also broke by 13 seconds the club's marathon record of 2:15.32 held by MATT BOND from the London Marathon of 2016.

2. SONIA SAMUELS was 1st L40 in 2:32.32 with one of the fastest L40 marathon performances of all time. It put her on top of her UK age-group marathon rankings. Her performance was further awesome in that she'd endured multiple bouts of illness following becoming a Mum and in the later stages of her marathon preparation got Covid. Sonia has represented GB in the marathon at the 2016 Rio Olympic Marathon, the 2018 European Championships and the 2018 Gold Coast Marathon and holds the club marathon record of 2:28.04 from Berlin in 2015.

3. SOPHIE WOOD made her marathon debut and massively surpassed her own expectations and was understandably thrilled to run 2:38.23. "I can't believe it" she said.

4. TIM RAINEY ran his 163rd marathon! That's awesome and surely a club record! Tim is an ultra-distance specialist and his 163rd marathon, includes 58 ultra marathons.

5.RANJIT BENNETT: If marathons are character building then Ranjit is top of the list for exceptional resilience to finish at the other end of the 14000 field in 5:27.06.

6. PETER SHIPLEY (2:37.47) recorded the biggest of all club PB's. In great form throughout the year he knocked a massive twenty minutes off his 2017 Manchester Marathon and dipped under 2:40 for the first time.

7. SIMON LATHAM (3:03.26) was the 2nd biggest improver. He knocked 10 minutes off his 2021 London Marathon.

8. JENNY FOX was the 3rd biggest improver. She knocked a chunky seven minutes off last year's Manchester Marathon for a new best of 3:14.55.

9. RACHEL ROZHDESTVENSKAYA (3.00.38) was 4th as she improved by a full 5 minutes on her 2014 St. Petersburg (Russia) Marathon and, had it not been for that dreadful 'Wall' would have achieved her first sub 3-hour marathon.

10. ALISTAIR KELL for 'true grit' that braved it even after two surgeries on a torn calf and his 3:08.50 was still very close to his best.

Sale Harriers lined the 26 mile route and cheered their colleagues and many marshalled the course and raised valuable revenue for Sale Harriers.

SCENIC PARIS MARATHON

On the same day as the Manchester Marathon, EDDIE EDWARDS, AARON STEELE and HELEN CARTER set off on the same 26.2 route through the most scenic parts of Paris. The weather had threatened snow but by the time the 35,757 runners lined up on the Sunday

they had clear skies and ideal running conditions, though still cold.

M45 Richard 'Eddie' Edwards was first home in 2.51.51, pretty much half an hour faster than his last marathon in 2018. Aaron was over the moon with an 11 minute PB of 3.09.21. This was Aaron's last outing with Sale Harriers as he'd decided to return to his native Northern Ireland with his wife and family, L40 Helen Carter finished in 3.38.31, an eight minute improvement on her 2016 Paris Marathon. She was having a great year at that point with a 2:48:11 at the Trimpell 20 a few weeks earlier. All three celebrated around the sights of Paris afterwards.

M70 JOHN ARCHER RUNS BOSTON

Congratulations to JOHN ARCHER who at the sprightly age of 70 travelled to the Boston Marathon and finished 2nd in his age category in 4:06 13. It was a lifetime ambition fulfilled! As part of his preparation he ran the Knighton '20' mile race and was 1st M70 in 2:46.53 a time that ranked him 6th in the UK.

SUPER 'OVER THE BALES'

Sale Harrier's Primary section launched their Spring/Summer season on a high note with their annual, very successful races over hav bales at Crossford Bridge. In the six races, Sale had four team victories and LUCY O'BRIEN and her brother LIAM were individual winners.

The U11 girls won first and second team thanks to GRACE HILL, HOLLY MC HUGH, ISABELLE CONNOLLY, MADDY APPLEBY, ROBIN HEYWOOD-WOOD and CAITHLIN WETERS.

The U9 boys also recorded a great win. Well done to TOBY HARRISON, DANIEL TOPPING and JOSH HOWELL

Of the 250 runners who competed 110 were Sale Harriers and overall Sale had 12 teams and 10 individuals finish in the top 3 placings and were awarded 46 plaques and medals.

NORTHERN 12/6 ROAD RELAYS

The Northern 12/6 Stage Road Relay Championships are the first major club championship of the Spring, ideal for club's to flex their competitive muscles coming from the long hard winter. Historically, Sale Harriers aims to be competitive among its Northern colleagues in championship like this. Success in them brings club prestige and that attracts newcomers!

The senior men finished 7th from the thirty Northern teams! Team manager JAMES BAILEY put out a strong team that comprised DANNY GRAY, NIGEL MARTIN, PHIL ROBERTSON, WILLIAM ONEK, JOE GOODWOOD, PAUL PETERS, DANIEL KASHI, TOM STEPHENSON, NICHOLAS TYNAN, NICHOLAS BARRY, BEN BRUNSWICH AND MATTHEW BARNES. Danny Gray was the club's fastest on the longer stages and Nigel Martin ran the day's fastest time on the short stage. Seventh was an improvement on 12th from pre-Covid 19 but it's not so many years ago Sale were regularly among the top five clubs and even were the Northern Champions. Leeds City AC, Salford Harriers & Hallamshire Harriers took the 2022 medals and continued to be the Northern top dogs

The unavailability of the club's top women who'd won the 2021 autumn Northern XC Relay Championships and did themselves so proud in the MACCL League etc, meant the section relied on younger, more inexperienced runners - LAURA MARTIN, LUCY ARMITAGE, CHIARA YOUNG, LAURA BARBER, ANOUSKA BROOKS AND CHARLOTTE LORD. They finished 16th from the 27 competing teams. Vale Royal AC, Hallamshire Harriers and Salford H &AC took the accolades. Neighbours Salford H & AC went on to become the National Champions!

The Northern championship incorporates an U15 & U17 5k road championship for boys and girls. Sale Harriers had no teams entered but a massive congratulations to OSCAR SCHOFIELD who became the Northern U15 Champion. On top of his best ever 2021, he continues to emerge as one of the North's very exciting runners.

NATIONAL 12/6 ROAD RELAY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Two weeks after the 'Northern's' were the National 12/6 Championships. JAMES BAILEY turned out a rather different team with seven of the twelve debutants to this major cauldron - ROBBIE RIGBY, ALEX BRADFORD, PHIL ROBERTSON, JOHN FAULKNER, SAM ASPINWALL, OLIVER BARTLETT and OLIVER HIGBY. From the sixty National teams Sale finished it's lowest ever in 33rd place - an unenviable record for the 2nd consecutive year! Southern clubs - Tonbridge, Highgate and Bedford & County AC took a clean sweep of the medals.

Sale's women had no team yet again in this major National Championship. For over a decade they've not fared well in either the 6 or the 12-stage Northern and National Championships. Come on, girls - next year!

KIRSTY LAW NEW SCOTTISH RECORD

At the beginning of April, KIRSTY LAW set a new W35 Scottish Discus record of 59.64m that was another qualifying standard for the Birmingham Commonwealth Games in July. Readers will recall how she broke the 60m barrier for the first time at the 2021 NAL match in Wavertree





HANNAH BLOOD SMASHES 60m

Competing in Monroe, Los Angeles, HANNAH BLOOD broke through the 60m barrier for the first time with an inspired hammer throw of 60.74m. This was a massive leap forward from her previous best of 58.46m and propelled her to 3rd in the U23 National rankings. Hannah is on a USA Collegiate scholarship. Congratulations, Hannah.

U13 **OONAGH MCMANUS** was selected to represent GB & NI at the European Biathle Championships in Marathon Greece 6-9th October. In her first ever Biathle competition, held at Cheltenham Lido in late April, she finished 5th in the continuous run/swim/run competition. This was astonishing because with her birthday not until October and still only 12 she had to compete in the U15 category.

Oonagh is an exciting young runner who ranks 5th in the UK on the track over 1200m and is a key member of Sale Harrier's teams on roads and cross-country. "She's also a very good swimmer" said her dad, "and the two complement each other very well".

GB CALL-UP FOR NIGEL MARTIN

April ended on a high for NIGEL MARTIN who received the long overdue and well-deserved news he was to make his GB & NI debut as one of eleven athletes to represent GB & NI at the inaugural IAU (International Association of Ultrarunners) 50km European championships in Avila, Spain on 8th October. Nigel achieved automatic selection following his 2:15.29 PB and club record in the Manchester Marathon.

LAUNCH OF YDL (Upper)

On the April weekend that Tyson Fury defended his heavyweight world title for the second time in front of 94,000 fans at Wembley, the club's U15 and U17 section donned their boxing gloves for their summer campaign of the YDL (Upper). Competing in the North Premier West Division against Liverpool H & AC, North Wales, Preston Harriers and Trafford

AC, their aim was to reach and win the Northern Final in July and qualify for the National Final at Sportcity in September. At the helm SARAH JAMES (Boy's) and KIRSTY EDGSON (Girl's) were team managers with Kirsty making her managerial debut.

The first match at Wavertree was a close tie with Trafford AC in which Sale came a close second, a good enough result to be on track for the Regional Final. "Every single point counted, so an extra big shout out to those who filled 'gaps' said both team managers. "It just goes to show how important it is to have athletes in as many events as possible. With just a couple more events filled, we would have won the match"

It was a day of memorable highpoints especially **AKIRA EDGSON** who smashed her 1500m PB by a massive nine seconds to 4:47 whilst also scoring maximum team points. She demonstrated how possible it is in these matches to achieve

BMAF ROAD RELAY SILVER FOR LOUISE, HELEN,
ANNE & HARRIET

At the end of April, L35 LOUISE WHITTAKER, HELEN ARMITAGE, ANNE CHINOY and HARRIET HAMILTON won brilliant L35 silver medals at the BMAF Road Relay Championships at Sutton Coalfield. This was their section's best ever result.

Louise threw down the gauntlet as she brilliantly did some months earlier at the BMAF XC Relays w

did some months earlier at the BMAF XC Relays when the section just missed out on bronze medals, She zipped round the course for the 4th fastest time of the day. Helen, Anne and Harriet maintained the high standard to bring home the silver medals. They finished just 58 seconds behing Gold medallists Cheshire Dragons. This championship annually brings together running legends of the past. Chorlton Runners were the men's M35 Champions.

NORTHERN T & F LEAGUE LAUNCH

The club launched its summer campaign of four matches in the Northern T & F League (West Premier Division) with JACK FROST (men) and DAVE MARSH (women) at the helm. Their aim was to become the Northern Premier League champions, despite the demands on a relatively small pool of people also competing in the National Athletic League.

The league's competing clubs were were Blackburn H & AC, Preston H, Team Isle of Man, West Cheshire AC and Wigan & District H &AC. The first match was held at Stanney Oakes track.

Sale finished 3rd – just 14 points short of victory and would have won had the match had it not been for the shortage of specialist athletes in jumps, hurdles and throws, a problem facing almost every club to some degree. As a result, the club had hardly any athletes in most of its 'B' technical events - male and female. She said, "After I gave birth to my daughter, I started to run with her and I realised I could keep quite a good pace. My 10k times without a buggy are around 38 minutes so I knew there might be a chance we could achieve it. Achieving this Guinness World Record is the absolute highlight of my running 'career' and I would love to be an inspiration to other mums who may want to take up buggy running too."

Whilst Rachael broke her world record **OLIVER HIGBY** recorded a PB of 38.51 that ensued to be his fastest of 2022

SALE LAUNCHES N.A.L CAMPAIGN

She also smashed her own PB by 10 seconds to record the 10th best on the world all-time lists. For her efforts she was presented with a £1500 cheque.

At the same BMC meeting fast improving AKIRA EDGSON was 'on fire' to run her 1500m in an 11 second PB and to record an ESAA Schools qualifier of 4:36 by 6 seconds and a National standard time! MEGAN DAVIES also recorded a fantastic 1500m PB of 4:19.49 in her first 1500m race for two years. NAJIB HASSAN also recorded a PB of 3:47.05 and ADETOMIWA OLADITI an 800m PB of 1:51.81.

BEST AT CHRISTLETON 5k



EMMA-LEIGH TOPS DOWN UNDER

Congratulations to former club member EMMA-LEIGH HEIGHWAY (now living in Australia) who won The Southern Sydney 24 hour Ultra Track Marathon just a few years after she was diagnosed with Rheumatoid arthritis and Trigeminal Neuralgia, the TN leading to complications whereby in 2018 she had to have brain surgery and learn to walk again.

In 2019 she then entered a 30k trail race and won it with a course record. Some time later, she was again first past the post (men and women) in a 12 hour ultra marathon and that success whet her appetite for the Sydney 24 hour ultra track race.

She wrote of the experience, "It was the first time I'd been on a track in 8 years and to say. I was excited was an understatement. in 2022As this was my first ever 48 hour event, my coach and I planned on getting to 200k's and seeing how I felt from there. With a goal of hitting 130k during day one, this was broken up into 3 laps running and 1 lap walking to converse strength. The weather wasn't great and included gale force winds and rain on the first night. My crew of 2 friends and my husband had a tent at the 100m start line and handed me coffee, soup, noddles and gels when needed. I felt great during the first night and had two 30min naps. During the 2nd night I had a 5 hour low where I was barely. The able to walk in a straight line. We began playing with shorter naps as the 30 minute naps alled to some nausea and stiffness on waking. However the 15 minute naps were good only for about 4k of movement before I strugglet to keep my eyes open. With 5 hours to go I made the decision to try an hour's sleep. After this I felt much better and was able to get a good pace going until the sun came up at 6am and was able to start running again. My 262k ranks me 2nd in Australia and 15th in the world".

3rd AGAIN IN NORTHERN LEAGUE

The club's again finished 3rd (and 4th overall) in its 2nd Northern League match and must therefore go 'Big' in the final July match at Wigan if it's to avoid relegation. The men's ER section did well filling almost every 'A' and 'B' discipline though the middle distance events still had far too many glaring gaps. The women again struggled to fill most of their 'B' 5 T technical and field events, as happened in the 1st match! Thanks to the club providing R I its full quota of officials - JON MASON, TONY CAMPBELL, ANDY WEBSTER, AUSTIN BOOTH, AYO, SHONIBARE and JACK FROST, the team were awarded the maximum 50 points which made an enormous difference.

NATIONAL ATHLETICS LEAGUE VICTORY

On the weekend of national pageantry to celebrate Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee, Sale Harriers won its 2nd National Athletic League match (NAL) (Championship Division) hosted by the club at Sportcity. BRIAN HOLROYD a Sale Harrier Shot Putt coach in the 80's & 90's, sadly passed away aged 72. Brian was the father of Life member SHELLEY HOLROYD who, between 1987 -2006 was a key member of legend Eric Hughes' women's teams who brought unprecedented success to the club keeping it at the top of the Premier League for an incredible thirty eight years during which time he won an incredible 23 Premier League Titles, represented British clubs in European Clubs competition and won the European Club's Cup. He had similiar success also in the younger age-group Leagues and Cups.

In those years, Shelley was the club's top class javelin thrower who represented GB at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics, the Kuala Lumpur & Melbourne Commonwealth Games and the 1993 and 1997 World Championships in Stuttgart and Athens.

She wrote "My Dad always had time for everyone. He started off as a football coach and was one of the most successful in the Salford area. His athletics coaching started at Salford Mets because he was taking me to training. Once he found out they didn't have a Shot Putt coach he volunteered. Not only did he become a well respected coach, he also helped a number of athletes get to training when their parents didn't have transport.

After a year of me being at Salford Met, I met Bill Nicholls, Sale Harriers Throws coach. He watched me throw the Javelin and, after a brief conversation, I made the decision to move to Sale Harriers aged 12. Bill became my coach and my Dad also started coaching for Sale and his athletes followed him to the club.

He continued his kindness of reliably picking up athletes and taking them to Crossford Bridge for training. He had many successes and was fondly remembered for his character and kindness. One athlete he coached, Kate Bateman, said 'Brian was a lovely man who had a heart of gold. He saw the best in us and knew exactly how to get the best out of us all. He was firm but fair and had a great sense of humour.'

I've received messages from athletes all over the world saying how great my Dad was and I maybe biased but I have to agree. Without him, and my Mum, I would have never become an Olympian."



LOUISE WHITTAKER CROWNED NATIONAL AQUATHLON CHAMPION

LOUISE WHITTER was crowned the 2022 L40 English Aquathlon Champion at their annual championships in Northamptonshire. She was among over 80 athletes who competed over an 750m open water swim and then a 5km run around the local lake. As a result she qualified for the 2022 World Triathlon Aquathlon Championships in Samorin in August. Her first major success in this sport came in 2013 when she finished 4th at the London ITU Aquathlon World championships.

In April Louise was one of the quartet who won the L35 British Masters Relay Gold medals.

The Mason Trophy is for students Years 8 -11 who have excelled at County schools championships and is a major milestone and proven testing ground on the way to the ESAA England School T & F (ESAA) Championships to be held in Manchester in July. U17 LEONARDO SCOTT (100m in a PB of 11.09) and U17 ALEX LEADBEATER (200m) also did brilliant winning their events.


Runners exiting the car-parks donated a magnificent £478 into St. Ann's Hospice collections buckets.

Said Helen, "It's taken 47 years, but I finally had the honour of wearing an England vest . It was brilliant". U13 OONAGH MCMANUS finished a tremendous 6th in the U15 National Biathle Championships (open water swim) in Salford Quays and received an invitation to the World Champs in Madeira. This followed her earlier selection to represent GB & NI in the European Biathle Championships in Greece in October. What an upcoming young star!

THEA BROWN & LAZARUS BENJAMIN ARE ESAA SCHOOLS CHAMPIONS

In mid-July THEA BROWN & LAZARUS BENJAMIN became prestigious English Schools Champions and six of their club colleagues became England Schools medallists. The 'Kid's Olympics' were held at Sportcity for the 2nd consecutive year but this time without Covid -19 restraints. Over 2000 school athletes took part in the 300 events over two days. Congratulations to Sale Harrier's Champions and medallists...

- LAZARUS BENJAMIN retained his senior Pole Vault title with 5.00m, a height he's become very familiar with. The club's phenomenal pole vaulter also holds the 2018 U15 School's
- THEA BROWN became the Inter Girl's high jump Schools Champion, still in her 1st year as an U17. She did it in style with a PB of 1.74m that confirmed her top of the UK age-group rankings. Thea, a Pentathlete by trade, is also the 2021 U15 English Schools Champion
- The Savage twins ELLIOT & EVAN both won ESSA silver medals, Elliot in the U20 800m and Evan in the U20 1500m. Elliot adds this silver medal to last year's bronze. Said NORMAN POOLE, their coach, "They're very well deserved silvers. They've also learnt more of the tactical awareness required for racing at the highest level when they become seniors".
- HERMIONE MASON won the U20 400m Hurdles silver medal and did it in style winning her heat and then producing a fantastic PB of 62.91 for silver in the final......similar to 2021 when she also won the intermediate 300m Hurdles silver medal with a PB.
- ANNABEL AMADIN, last year's intermediate Shot Putt champion, was this year's silver medallist. She just missed out on the title by a measly four centimetres.

DAVID PROCTOR IS WORLD MASTERS 1500m CHAMPION

A dream come true! Representing GB Masters, middle distance specialist DAVID PROCTOR became the World Masters 1500m Champion in Tampere, Finland. He said, "I thought a gold medal was above my expectations. I hadn't had the best preparation as I'd been suffering with a hamstring issue and was also unwell a few weeks earlier. I used the last National League match to practice racing tactically and it paid off. I'd hoped that if I had a really good day and the stars aligned, I might get on the podium, but I had never expected to win gold and become the World champion. Very happy indeed"

This was Dave's second GB Masters representation of 2022 having made his debut in February competing over 3000m at the European Indoor Championships in Braga, Portugal. Two weeks before that in Boston (USA) he achieved a UK Vet-35 UK 1 mile Indoor record of 4:08.63 to top of the British ranking. Dave is coached by NORMAN POOLE at the Wythenshawe track. His 1500m PB of 3.41.5 also ranks him No1 V35 in the UK

SALE SIZZLER 5k (2)

As runners arrived for the 2nd Sizzler 5k, contractors were still re-surfacing the car-park! All ended well thanks to course manager MIKE DUNNE'S organizational skills and effective liaisons with the contractors. The race was another sell-out! Twenty four of the 490 finishers were Sale Harriers.

- Race Doctor STEFAN SCHUMACHER (25.22) ran his 2nd fastest time for 11 years and just missed a PB by 3 seconds.
- HELEN ARMITAGE (19.32) was 1st L45 and JACQUELINE CORDINGLEY (21.32) was 1st L60.

NICK TYNAN GOES SUB-16

A day he won't forget! In the Podium 5k in Barrowford, NICKTYNAN dipped under 16 minutes for the first time ever to record a new best of 15.55 knocking a chunky 15 seconds off his previous best.

ENGLAND CHAMPIONS SOPHIE, LAZARUS & SUCCESS

At the England Athletics U20/U23 championships at Bedford SOPHIE ASHURST (PV), LAZARUS BENJAMIN (PV) and SUCCESS EDUAN (200m) won England titles and qualified for the World Junior Championships in Cali, Colombia (1-6 August). The match took place in searing heat and record temperatures of 40 degrees.

- U20 pole vaulter LAZARUS BENJAMIN retained his U20 title with a clean scorecard up to 5.00m, a height he then cleared first-time to win the EA title. He'd earlier qualified for Cali at June's UK Senior Championships, so was doubly on the plane to Colombia.
- U20 pole vaulter SOPHIE ASHURST also retained her U20 England title. Though
 4.00m won her the title she too had already secured her flight to the World Junior Championships from two earlier qualifying marks at UK Indoor Championships and the Mannheim International in Germany.
- U20 200m specialist SUCCESS EDUAN was smooth, powerful and sensational in the final 40m to win her title and secure her place to the World U20 Championships. (She'd won the U20 Championships as an U17 last year so she's also retained her EA title).

There were several other very impressive club performances ...

- U20 Triple Jumper MELISSA BOOTH won the silver medal and was in contention for the gold until the final stages.
- U20 Hammer specialist JASMINE RICHARDSON, U23 Hammer specialist HANNAH BLOOD,
 U23 High Jumper, BETHANY WOODHEAD, U20 400m hurdler HERMIONE MASON all came very close to a bronze medal.
- U20 LUCY ARMITAGE (1500m) and U23 BLAKE TIGER-LEE BROWN (U23100m) were rewarded with PB's in their heats (4.37.86 and 10.73 resp.)

THEA BROWN & ANNABEL AMADIN REPRESENT INTERNATIONAL SCHOOLS

A few weeks after becoming ESAA Schools Champion, THEA BROWN and bronze medallist, ANNABEL AMADIN were selected to represent England in the outdoor SIAB Home International Schools held at the Mary Peter's track in Belfast.

- Thea improved her high jump PB and club record to a new 1.75m to finish 3rd with the bronze medal and secured her place as Britain's No.1 age-group high jumper. She's edging ever closer to Chloe Cozens long standing U17 club record of 1.79m which has stood since 1996!
- Annabel was a magnificent 2nd in the Shot representing England, beating the newly crowned ESAA Schools Champion. This was an improvement on her 3rd place last year.

 Annabel is the 2022 ESAA Inter Girl's Shot Putt silver medallist and 2021 Champion.

Over 260 U17 Age Group athletes from England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales converged on the Mary Peters track on the hottest days ever recorded in England. The hot, humid conditions proved ideal for very competitive athletics, with several personal bests.









WORLD ATHLETIC CHAMPIONSHIPS AIMEE SMASHES BRITISH RECORD TWICE

At the World Athletic Championships in Oregon, **AIMEE PRATT** smashed the British 3000m steeplechase record TWICE! In qualifying for the final, she ran the race of her life to record a seven second PB and improved the British record to 9:18.91 "That's one of the fastest times needed to reach a final" she said. She then obliterated the record again in the final by a further three seconds "record 9:15.64 and, at the time, was the fastest ever run by a British female since the 3000m steeplechase was first introduced into the World Championships in 2005. She said: "I'm overwhelmed! I knew the race was going to go out hard so I just tried to be sensible and work my way back to the field which I feel like I did quite well. I've been dying for a race like that for a long time. I wanted to finish top eight and I'm still quite early on in my career. I think I am at a good place in my career right now and the next few years I'm expecting to step up a lot."

WORLD ATHLETIC CHAMPIONSHIPS JONA EFOLOKO WINS RELAY BRONZE

JONA EFOLOKO won the 4 x 100m relay bronze on the penultimate day of the World Athletic Championships. He was a new recruit to the new-look GB quartet and ran a storming first leg that gave the team the necessary lead for Zharnel Hughes and Nethaneel Mitchell-Blake to move away from the pack and have Prescod come home hard for the bronze medal. Jona is a former World Junior 200m Champion. Well done. Jona!

WORLD ATHLETIC CHAMPIONSHIPS Dr. JOHN RODGERS IS GB TEAM DOCTOR

DR JOHN RODGERS, a long time Sale Harrier who works as a Consultant in Sport & Exercise Medicine with an NHS practice at Manchester University NHS Foundation Trust and also works as Medical Director at the Manchester Institute of Health and Performance and is a Visiting Professor in Sport & Exercise Medicine at Manchester Metropolitan University, was appointed GB Team Doctor for the World Athletic Championships. He said, "We spent 10 days at a holding camp in Oregon and then 10 days at the competition location in Eugene. It was a busy trip medically and days were spent managing various injuries, illnesses and travel health related issues. It was an amazing experience to be track-side for the 1500m final which was my event when I used to compete and all the more special as his dad and coach Geoff was the stadium commentator for the race"

DAVE MARSH HELPS RAISE £14,000

DAVE MARSH with his team of NACRO colleagues took on the epic 24 hour National Three Peaks Challenge and raised £14,000 to purchase an accessible minibus to support NACRO's great work of Outdoor Learning across Gtr. Manchester. Dave more than achieved his personal target of £300.

They achieved it despite atrocious weather with torrential rain, strong winds and long difficult descents in the dark. Dave was part of NACRO's 'A' team who first climbed Ben Nevis (1345m) then Scafell Pike, England's highest mountain and at 3am they began their climb of Snowden amidst threatening 75mph winds and completed it at 6.25 am to smash the 24 hour challenge.

Nacro is a charity that helps disadvantaged young people and adults to turn their lives around and the staff and volunteers run adventurous and challenging outdoor learning programmes that equip people with valuable skills for education, work and life.

A SIZZLING SIZZLER

The calm, overcast evening for the 3rd early August Sizzler was perfect for PB's. Among the 490 finishers the most notable record was Warrington's Steve Watmough who smashed the M60 course record to a new best of 16.50 that was the fastest M60 in the UK. On the final day of the Commonwealth Games **JONA EFOLOKO** comfortably stormed to win team gold in the 4 x 400m relay in a season's best of 38.35 seconds. As he did so brilliantly earlier at the World Athletic Championships, he was the lead leg exploding from the blocks and with a series of smooth changeovers from the rest of the team, recorded the team's 6th championship title in nine Games.

OLIVIA GREEN WINS WORLD PENTATHLON GOLD

In her 1st senior UIPM World Modern Pentathlon Championships, **OLIVIA GREEN** won GB Team Gold and finished her best ever position of 5th and was top British athlete. "I'm over the moon" she said.

Olivia, a talented member of Sale Harriers endurance section, was one of a strong squad of six Pentathlon GB athletes that took place in the historic Egyptian City of Alexandria.

She made her World Championships debut in 2019 and was selected for this championship having recorded her best ever senior placing of 6th. Also on the team was her boyfriend Olympic Champion Joe Choong and his brother Henry Choong. H

Throughout 2022 Olivia has represented GB & NI in the Modern Pentathlon in Bulgaria, Hungry and Poland. In November 2021 she became the European U24 Champion.

GEORGIA TAYLOR-BROWN WINS COMMONWEALTH TRIATHLON GOLD

GEORGIA TAYLOR-BROWN, the club's Tokyo Olympian, won the Triathlon silver medal on the opening day of the Birmingham Commonwealth Games and, a few days later, she also won the Mixed Relay Gold medal exactly a year after becoming the Olympic Mixed Relay Champian

In winning Triathlon silver, Georgia took on Bermuda's Flora Duffy and matched her in the swim and bike. They dismounted together but Duffy had a faster transition and took a five second-lead over Georgia which she just couldn't bridge. "I gave it everything but it wasn't enough to take down the triathlon queen" said Georgia

In becoming the Commonwealth Games Champion, she came out of the water with a 24 second lead, set off alone on her bike with a massive one minute lead and stormed to victory by a lengthy forty-six seconds and then dashed off to Wembley to witness the English Lionesses become European Champions and to make football history.





AIMEE, ABIGAIL & KIRSTY BOW OUT IN COMMONWEALTH GAMES

AIMEE PRATT just missed out on bronze in the 3000m steeplechase in a time of 9:27.41. Her race was blown wide open right from the start as the two Kenyans and the Ugandan opened up such a big gap that it seemed the rest of the field were battling for bronze. Lizzie Bird was ahead of Aimee when the Ugandan took a heavy fall and was best placed to benefit and took the silver medal with Aimee finishing 4th

KIRSTY LAW bowed out 7th in the discus final. On a fabulously entertaining night she wrote, "I'm frustrated. As athletes we train so hard and sacrifice a hell of a lot for these moments. We forget to enjoy the experience and get hung up on performances"and was off to Portugal to prepare for the European Championships.

ABIGAIL IROZURU Eventhough she'd fouled the first two jumps her season's best 6.59m in the third round was enough to qualify for the final. She was disappointed n the final because her best mark of 6.19m wasn't enough to get three further jumps and so she finished 12th overall.

FIVE HARRIERS - COMMONWEALTH GAMES OFFICIALS

Apart from the athletes, five Sale Harriers were centrally involved with important responsibilities in delivering the very successful Birmingham Commonwealth Games.

- Life Member **DIANE MODAHL MBE** was appointed to the Commonwealth Games England Board as a Non-Executive Director and Chair the Sports Committee. She was directly involved demonstrating the very best of English sporting talent to the world and took great pleasure to host various dignitaries, VIP'S and athletes in an ambassadorial capacity as well as attend the various sports. "I got the same enjoyment as I did as a former athlete" she said. "I have to say being asked by the Commonwealth Games Federation to award the medals to the Women's 800m medallist will remain a pretty special memory for life."
- JESS TAYLOR-JEMMETT was a member of the England Athletics staff training programme in the build up to the Games. Jess is a multi-event coach at Sportcity who won heptathlon bronze at the 2014 Commonwealth Games.
- Club President DAVID BROWN CBE was appointed a Secretary to Jury of Appeal.
- Club Chairman JON MASON was a Chief Field Judge
- CAROL BROWN was an Umpire for the Marathons

SEUN, NICK & SHAUNNA WIN ENGLAND MEDALS

NICHOLAS WALSH, SEUN OKOME and SHAUNNA THOMPSON all won major medals at the EA Championships in Bedford.

- SEUN OKOME retained his 2021 triple jump silver medal with a great leap of 15.45m, his best ever result in this Championship.
- NICHOLAS WALSH won 100m bronze in a high pressured race as less than 0.1covered the first four athletes.
- SHAUNNA THOMPSON retained her Shot Putt bronze medal with a throw of 15.37m. Last year her PB of 14.23m won her the same medal! She's made massive strides in the 12 months to a PB of 15.55m achieved at the Muller British Championships.

MOUNTAIN TOO HIGH! YDL (Lower) NORTHERN FINAL

Sale Harriers juniors travelled to York for the YDL (Lower) Northern Final. The match was between the top three Premier East & Premier West Divisions and the winners would qualify for the National YDL Final at Sportcity in September. Sale came to it as the 2020 North-West Champions, Northern Champions and National YDL Champions.

Most of the squad happened to be holiday or at the Commonwealth Game, so it turned out to be a disappointing day and hard-working **CARL WORTHINGTON** was again alone as team manager. From the club's U15 girls, only **NIAMH DOLAN** was available and just twenty athletes attended the match. Though they rallied fantastically with many doubling and trebling in unfamiliar events, scoring an impressive 317 points, the mountain was too high and they finished a disappointing 5th.

The U15 sprinters again dominated with DAVID SHOBUNDE, JEFFERSON ADENUGA and MAX CUNNINGHAM all gaining 1st place. They later joined teammate, JOSHUA BLACKBURN to compete in the 4x 100m relay and gained a respectful 2nd place. In the pole vault, CALUM PARK vaulted 3.20m to win maximum points and record a PB. Later he joined teammates, LIAM O'BRIEN, JAMES O'BRIEN and MATTHEW CULLEN BROWN to run the 4x300m relay. Other great 800m PB's were MADELINE APPLEBY (2. 44.3) PAIGE BROWN (2:44.3) and JAMES O BRIEN (2:07.5)

The U13 boys had a clean sweep in the sprints. MATTHEW ADENUGA won both the 75m & 150m (A race). KIERAN STAFFORD won the 75m (B race) and OLIVER HOWELL won the 150m (B race). They then joined up with teammate DANIEL WELLS to win the 4x100m relay in a time of 56.47 secs. The top middle distance U13 boy was DANIEL OAKES who ran a fantastic race to win the 1.200m in 3 mins 40.44 secs to rank 6th in the UK.

The U13 middle distance girls were again outstanding! In the 800m race, **BEATRIX SOPER** won the A race and **LOLA RICHARDSON** won the B race and gained maximum points. Not to be out done, **OONAGH MCMANUS** won the 1,200m A race and **CAITLIN WETTERS** won the B race. Oonagh, Lola and Caitlin then joined **LOLA BROWN** in the 4x100m relay.

Last and certainly not least, **ANGEL AMADIN** showed the potential of her older sister as the team's U13G thrower achieving a new PB in the shot.

AUGUST

SUCCESS, SOPHIE, LAZARUS REPRESENT GB IN WORLD U20 CHAMPIONSHIPS

SUCCESS EDUAN (200m & 4 x 100m), SOPHIE ASHURST (Pole Vault) and LAZARUS BENJAMIN (Pole Vault) represented GB & NI at the World Athletics U20 Championships in Cali, Colombia, the latest pinnacle in their successful careers. Sophie was further selected as the GB Team captain, a honour she also had at last year's European U20 Championships. Her dad Andy was also selected as a team coach. Andy is a Seoul Olympian who's represented GB & NI also at three Commonwealth Games (1986 Edinburgh, 1990 Auckland and 1994 Victoria) and is the Edinburgh C.G Pole Vault Champion.

- Sophie secured her qualification to the final achieving the qualifying height of 4.05m with Gemma Tutton. Just as the final started, the heaven's opened with a tropical storm that forced it to be rescheduled to the following morning. Again, in a very close competition where both cleared 4.10m, Sophie finished 6th in the world on countback.
- Lazarus vaulted a below par 4.90m in the qualifying round and missed out on the final.
 He admitted his disappointment and said "I felt good, everything was alright. I just I didn't move up the pole quick enough. Its alright, it's what happens. Mistakes happen."
- Success, last year's European U20 200m bronze medallist, also missed out on a place in the final. Her time of 23.56 (-0.2m/s) was just outside the time required for non-automatic qualification. Said her lead coach Anita Richardson, "Success has a lot of positives to take from this and her season. She's still only 17, has had an amazing season winning the England outdoor and indoor championships and the Loughborough internationals. She was hoping to be a finalists at the Worlds but is still among the world's best".

These three athletes are entirely 'home-grown' by excellent teams at Sportcity and are a particular delight for Sale Harriers. Lazarus is coached by pole vaulters MATT CULLEN and ANDY ASHURST with DAVE CAMPBELL his strength and conditioning coach. Success' lead coach is ANITA RICHARDSON and she's also part of a great team with CLOVIS ASONG, a past junior GB sprint medallist and retired sprinter PAULA DUNN who represented GB at the 1988 Seoul Olympics and is a five time Commonwealth Games medallist and the current Paralympic Head Coach and the first female head coach appointed by UK Athletics. Sophie is coached by her dad and also by Loughborough University where she's studying. She said of her captaincy, "To captain the team feels really special, I'm very honoured. I want to bring a positive, uplifting energy for everyone and be there for the team".

The World U20 Championships provides the first glimpse of the athletics superstars of the future. Usain Bolt, Haile Gebrselassie and Dina Asher-Smith are among those who started their career at the World U20 Champs.

DIANE MODAHL MBE AWARDS COMMONWEALTH

Life Member **DIANE MODAHL MBE** has had many proud moments personally and professionally and she regarded the honour of being asked by the Commonwealth Games Federation to award the 800m medals to Kenya's Mary Moraa, England's Keely Hodginson and Scotland's Laura Muir as among the most special. The ceremony was on August 8th delayed because of an appeal.

Diane is one of Britain's most successful 800m runners who took a clean sweep of gold, silver and bronze at three Commonwealth Games (1986,1990 & 1998) and competed at four Olympic Games. She was unbeaten by any other British athlete over six consecutive seasons and held the English, British and Commonwealth records for both 800m and 600m). She was especially inspired by the last gasp attack by Kenya's Mary Moraa to snatch the gold medal from Keely Hodginson and Laura Muir.

FOURTH THEY CAME! NORTHERN PREMIER LEAGUE

The fourth and final Northern League match of 2022 took place in Blackburn in mid-August and was the all-important one to confirm how Sale Harriers fared against it's season's objective to become league Champions. Fourth they came behind champions Blackburn ,West Cheshire and Team Isle of Man.

Despite several great victories, team managers again had too small a pool of athletes with all too many required to double and to treble in unfamiliar events – people like BLAKE,TIGER-LEE BROWN (100m & 200m), JACOB LINGARD (400m & TJ), PHIL ROBERTSON (1500m, 5000m), CHRIS DOWNS (400mH,) SAM EBONINE (LJ, TJ, HJ), SAM DEAN (Shot, Javelin), SOFIJA DRAGISIC WOOD (400mH 110mH, 3000m S/C), BRIA BULLARD (100m, 200m), SHAUNNA THOMPSON (Shot, Discus) and ANNABEL AMADIN (Shot, Discus), NATHAN BOOTH and MIA GIBBONS

The widespread demise of technical event athletes, especially among the women, is a concern nationally as well as locally. However, Sale Harriers with its vast catchment area and long tradition of success in women's sections, currently suffers more than most. The extent to which these underlying issues are addressed will be the bed-rock for becoming Northern Champions next year.

THIRD NORTHERN CLUB IN YDL (Upper)

Sale's U15 & U17 boys and girls ended their YDL (Upper) season as the 3rd Northern club. This followed their regional final in York. York AC were crowned Champions and Trafford were the the runner's up. "It was a credible result" agreed both team managers but they also believed the squad had the possibility to become Northern Champions and to reach the National YDL Final at Sportcity in September. "It was the old 'chestnut' of far too many competitive gaps and on this occasion they were mostly among the men". Parents LISA MASON and CAROLINE COLQUHOUN-LYNN wrote of the match, "We were so impressed with everyone doing so many events".

- MARTINS OGEDENBE DOBIES also had an amazing championship to win the U17 High Jump with a magnificent PB of 1.96m. Martins began high-jumping just 2 year's ago and has progressed from 1.76m to rank 4th in the UK. He's also the Northern Indoor Silver medallist and Gtr. Manchester Champion.
- ALEX LEADBEATER won the U17 200m silver medal. Again this is a career pinnacle. He'd just joined Sale Harriers at the time and is the Cheshire County and Schools 200m
- U13 DANIEL OAKES produced the 17th fastest 800m time in the UK in finishing 4th.

SIX REPRESENT GB IN EUROPEAN CHAMPS& JONA EFOLOKO WINS RELAY GOLD

JONA EFOLOKO won GB 4 x 100m Gold medal at the European Athletic Championships in Munich. He took the 3rd leg, ran a brilliant bend and provided Mitchell-Blake with a metre buffer, allowing him to storm to the title and the Gold medal. He now adds this to his Commonwealth Games Silver medal and his World Championships Bronze medals. He was one of six Sale Harriers who represented GB & NI at the Championships.

AIMEE PRATT qualified for the 3000m steeplechase final in 4th with a confident performance as did her colleague Lizzie Bird, the one she's traded the British record with throughout the summer, "I just did the bare minimum and now I'm excited for the final" she said. Unfortunately, it didn't come together as she'd hoped and her early season objective to medal in this Championship faded in the second half when a group of five broke away that included Bird and Aimee. Bird kept herself in the medal places over the final few laps whilst the gap between her and Aimee widened with Lizzie winning the bronze medal and Aimee in 7th in a time of 9:35.31.

REYNOLD BANIJO qualified for the long-jump final by leaping out to 7.75m in his 2nd jump. Because he fouled his 3rd jump he said, "It was a nerve-wracking wait after I'd fouled to see if I'd make the final" He finished 10th with a best of 7.66m

ABIGAIL IROZURU didn't make it to the long-jump final and bowed out in her heat with a hest of 6.15m

KIRSTY LAW had hoped to reach the Discus final. Her team-mate qualified with 57.68m, a distance Kirsty had thrown just a week earlier in Portugal. The best she could do, though, on this occasion was 54.83m which wasn't good enough. Both girls have been friends and team mates since aged 13 and have made valuable contributions to the club's YDL success through the years.

MATT BARNES & KATHY WELLAM REPRESENT GB IN EUROPEAN TRIATHLON CHAMPS.

MATT BARNES won the M45 silver medal and KATHY WELLAM was 14th in her L40 category at the European Age Group Sprint Triathlon Championships in Munich. For Matt, it came on top of his silver medal at June's World Triathlon Championships "It came down to the run" he said, "where I pulled away from the rest of the chasing pack with the fastest run split of

KATHY WELLAM was 15th in her category. For more than 20 years Kathy has been a big asset to the club's T & F team competing over 800m, 400m and and 400m hurdles. Over much of that period, she's travelled the world and Europe on the ITU International and ETU European Triathlon and Aquathlon circuits. Her latest achievement came just a few weeks after becoming the double Northern U17 Shot & Discus champion with a CBP. She's now just 04cms away from taking the UK's No.1 position from Megan Porterfield! She's made great progress also in the discus throughout 2022 improving her PB to 43.70m achieved in the Northern League at Wigan in July.
- THEA BROWN became the U17 EA 200m Silver medallist with a PB of 24.59 losing out only to the European U18 Champion! This was quite an achievement for the club's multi-eventer who's in the 1st year of this age-group. The terrain was challenging with a third on the beach, a third on extremely boggy fell and a third on road...."a really hard, but an epic adventure" she described it.

SCARLETT & DANIEL COMBINED EVENTS STARS

SCARLETT WHITTAKER was 1st U23 and DANIEL OAKES a tremendous 2nd in his first ever Pentathlon. Aged just 13 at mid-September's Trafford Combined Events Classic he scored a super1663 points. Both had a great 2022, their achievements recorded throughout this magazine.

DANIEL KASHI recorded a great PB of 68.06, twenty-five seconds faster than his previous best the Wrexham HM.

THEA BROWN - ESAA HEPTATHLON CHAMPION

What a weekend for THEA BROWN! At the ESAA England Schools Combined Events Championships at Bedford, not only did she win the England Schools National U17 Heptathlon title whilst still a year young but she did it in exceptional style with PB's and

At the end of the two days of competition she came away with five PB's from seven events - PB's in the 80m Hurdles (11.14), 800m (2:34.15), high jump (1.80m), Shot (11.23m), 200m (24.46) giving her a Heptathlon score of 5030 points which was also a PB.

Her PB's in the 80m Hurdles, High Jump and Heptathlon are also three new club records. (She already owns the 80m Hurdles and Heptathlon) finally smashing Chloe Cozens long standing U17 high jump club record of 1.79m which has stood since 1996. To top it off, she was selected to represent England at the ESAA International Pentathlon in

NICK BARRY also was in excellent shape and was the leading British man home in a brilliant time 2:23.21, a ten second improvement on

his Manchester Marathon in April. Great things ahead, I'm sure, for super fit Nick.

He wrote, "What an awesome experience! I'd hoped for more individually, but can't say I'm too disappointed. The team depth was incredible, three minutes separating the entire men's team! The course was very challenging and though I thought I'd paced it well, I'd not managed the course smartly enough. When it came to the last 15k my legs were too battered to finish strong and I just had to gut it out. An Ultra should be a challenge just to finish and on this course it certainly was".

OONAGH Mc MANUS MAKES GB **DEBUT & WINS GOLD & BRONZE** . KATHY WELLAM L40 GOLD & BRONZE

Still only 12 years old and competing in the U15 age category OONAGH MCMANUS represented GB & NI at the European Biathle Championships in Athens and won an individual bronze and team gold medals.

Oonagh took the race out fast, separating the field with a solid first run. Entering the water in 2nd place, a fantastic swim saw her come out of the sea holding her 2nd position. The last 800 meters of her run was a tense affair with the lead changing hands and Oonagh slipping to 4th place. ENGLAND ATHLETICS COMBINED EVENTS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Four of Sale Harrier's top Combined Events athletes had a brilliant weekend at the England Athletics Indoor Senior & U20 Combined Events Championships in Sheffield. Their 2022 achievements are recorded throughout the pages of this magazine.

- U20 MORGAN WHITE, a Sale Harrier since he was thirteen, produced PB's in the 1000m, 60m Hurdles, Pole Vault, Long Jump and Shot and just missed winning the EA bronze with a Heptathlon PB score of 4577 points.
- SCARLETT WHITTAKER, a Sale Harrier since she was eleven, also produced a string of PB's in the 60m Hurdles, High Jump and Shot to improve her indoor Pentathlon score to 3313 points.
- FREYA DOCKERTY, a Sale Harrier since she was fifteen, PB'd in the Shot and recorded a U20 Pentathlon PB of 2852 points.
- ELLISE FRYER-FRANCIS, a Sale Harrier since she was thirteen, came very close to improving her Pentathlon PB in the U20 competition.

PHIL ROBERTSON MERSEYSIDE XC CHAMPION

After three long years of what he described as 'indifferent performances' PHIL ROBERTSON returned to winning way to win the Merseyside Cross-Country Championship in Arrow Park. Indeed, his last (non-track) victory was in 2020 when he also became the Merseyside Champion but this victory was especially delightful in that he was among a home crowd. A delighted Phil wrote on social media, "The win was made even better for doing it on home turf in front of property parents and people who have supported my running for many years, especially Dave Wilkes and Nick Lindsay". Phil has been at the front end of every senior Merseyside XC Championship since 2013 and was the silver medallist in 2019 and 4th in 2022.

SPARE A THOUGHT FOR NICK

NICK BARRY was just one second shy of a top-three finish in Helsby's Four Villages Half Marathon with a time of 69:20. He recorded his PB of 66.27 earlier in the year in the top-notch Antrim Coast Half Marathon and might well have been among the top three had he not competed in the Cockermouth HM a week earlier.

- WENDY TERRY, RICHARD OUSEY and TRACEY TAYLOR also had every reason to celebrate. Wendy (96.21) celebrated a 6 second PB on her 2019 Helsby for 4th
- L45, Richard (96.21) recorded a 32 second PB
- TRACEY TAYLOR (1.44.19) recorded her best in four years.

GREATESTIN Gtr. MANCHESTER XC CHAMPS

Sale Harriers were tops in the 2022 Gtr. Manchester XC Championships at Leverhulme Park, Bolton. Postponed from December, three club particularly featured - Sale Harriers, Trafford AC and Salford H & AC. Trafford were tops with four championship titles but Sale Harriers won eight sets of team medals.

County Cross-Country Championships are not what they were. This year, there was an R R average of just 30 in most of the younger age-group races, less than 12 in the U20 race, just 26 in the women's race and 78 in the men's race.

- The U13 Girls were the club's most successful. Seven of the first eight were a parade of green hooped vests with BEATRIX SOPER the Champion, OONAGH MCMANUS, improved on last year's bronze, won silver and CAITLIN WETTERS won the bronze medal. Had there been an 'A' & 'B' team LOLA RICHARDSON, MAYA ROSS, GRACE HILL, PHEOBE CARROLL, ISABELLE CONNOLLY, ISLA ANDERSON and MADDIE APPLEBY would have been the silver and bronze medallists. - The senior men returned to being Gtr. Manchester Champions. They'd held the title, T continuously since 2018 but last year surrendered it to Salford. ALEX LAWTON led the 5 triumph making his Sale Harrier debut and probably had his finest hour in ten years of 5 running, winning his first county medal silver. He led home KENT HUNT, ALEX BRADFORD and TOM GOUGH for the Championship title leaving East Cheshire & Bury in their wake.
- The U15 girls were the largest team with nine finishers and they won great silver medals.
 EMILY PURDY took the individual championship and ISOBEL HALL, last year's U13
 Champion, just missed bronze by a few feet. This squad's strength and friendship has exciting potential. Well done IMOGEN HILL, MADISON HOLT, MADELINE GILLAM, NIAMH COPE, HOLLY NOLAN, AMBER WEBB and MOLLY IRWIN. You're all great!
- The U13 boys retained last year's silver medals and not far off Trafford who retained the title.

- The U17 men were 2021 champions but this year just had FINLAY DAY running as an TE individual. The U20 men, last year's bronze medallists, were similiar in that they had only ROBBIE RIGBY running as an individual.

OSCAR SCHOFIELD BREAKS BRITISH RECORD

OSCAR SCHOFIELD ran a British Indoors U17 1500m record of 3:52.53 at the British Miler's Indoor races that were incorporated into the EA Combined Events Championships in Sheffield.

This was just Oscar's latest record. In August at the England U17 Championships in Bedford, his 3000m PB of 8.24.09 smashed the club's record by 11 seconds, a record held by James Philippson since way back in 2003. He also broke Jonathan Richards' = 42 year 3000m record of 8:26.92 that had stood since 1980, the oldest Championship outdoor record in the books.

MEGAN DAVIES WINS SCOTTISH SILVER

MEGAN DAVIES is becoming quite a Scottish star! On this occasion she won the silver medal at the Scottish Indoor 3000m Championships in Glasgow. This placed her 4th in the UK, her highest ever placing over any of her racing distances. During the summer, as you earlier read, she represented Scotland twice during 2022.

CROSSFORD BRIDGE DEVELOPMENTS APPROVED

Final approval was given to install a full sized 3G floodlit pitch on the Crossford Bridge site. For the past 12 months, the Crossford Bridge Management Association (CMBA) has been working with the Football Foundation and the City Council on the project. It will include:

- A full sized floodlit 3G pitch (on the pitch parallel to the motorway)
- Expansion and resurface the car park (closest to the A56). The car park next to the athletics track will not be affected.
- Upgrade the footpath which runs around the outside of the athletics compound, linking the new pitch. This will be lit with low level lighting.

It's anticipated the project will be completed in September 2023. In addition funding has been secured to upgrade the track-side hammer cage and the stairs to the main changing room will be remodelled to support the needs of football users. See the images of the final project.

PAUL BARRETT is the club's representative on the CBMA trustees and has worked with the local Authority and Football Foundation on behalf of the club to help deliver this project.

THE FLYING BEA



Memories will linger of the 'saucer's grimacing, grimy mud with shoes lost, but it was a great day of cross-country in which Northern clubs 'big hitters' from Morpeth to Manchester pitched camp on a bleak, misty Witton Park.

- First off were the U20 women and what a winning start the club had, taking the silver medals.
 LUCY ARMITAGE has been a consistent top performer in the MACCL and would deliver yet again but the emergence of AKIRA EDGSON on her tail in her first year in this age-group and first cross-country of the year, was a special delight. You should have seen her mum's excitement! ISABELLE BURKE & LIZZIE HILL are back-bones of this age-group and all four deserve their medals.
- The U17 lads had only FINLAY DAY and SAM PEARCE to fly the green-hooped vest so their section recorded the club's 6th consecutive year with no team in this championship.
- The U15 boys 5th was their highest position since pre-Covid when they were silver the medallists
- The U15 girls were a much improved 7th from their 11th in Pontefract last year.laying the foundations (hopefully) to return to heady pre-Covid days when they were regular medallists and the 2017 champions

- DANIEL OWOSENI had an amazing weekend. He recorded PB's in the 200m, 60m and Long Jump
- MATTHEW ADENUGA also had a great weekend of PB's in the 60m and 200m.

EVA IS DOUBLE WELSH CHAMPION

Congratulations to EVAANWYL who was crowned U13 double Welsh National Champion winning gold in the 60m Hurdles and the 60m Sprint at their National Championships in Cardiff. Not only that but she smashed her PB again to record a new best of 9.93 and further secure her place on top of the UK rankings.

Recall how in December Eva, in her first ever 60m Hurdles and first year with Sale Harriers, had already rocketed to No.1 in the UK with her PB of 10.07 at the Northern Indoor Open meeting at Sheffield.

She finished 4th beating many classy internationals and just missed out on 3rd place. She also did it in style with a PB of 9.15, fifteen seconds faster than she'd ever run before. She was one of eight athletes rewarded with Scottish vests, her 3rd Scottish representation in the past 12 months and her 5th in total.

Megan is still coached - remotely by supremo PAUL RODEN who sadly left the successful Wythenshawe 'stable' earlier in the year. The club wishes Paul the very best and thanks him for his years of expertise, professionalism, sacrifices and commitment to the development of so many athletes.

OSCAR SMASHES 2ND BRITISH RECORD

YOUTHS CENTRE STAGE AT NATIONAL INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Britain's best U15, U17 & U20 youngsters gathered in Sheffield for the highlight of their winter indoors and what a weekend for Sale's youth.

- U17 THEA BROWN won two national titles. Her first came on the opening day of the championships winning the Long Jump with a PB of 5.95m that put her as British No.1. This was also a club recordand she did all of this on her very first jump. Thea now holds 4 U17 club records 80m Hurdles, Heptathlon, high jump and Long Jump.
- U17 THEA BROWN 2nd National title was yet another stand-out performance. She powered to the 60m Hurdles National title in 8.39 seconds, leaving clear daylight between her and her Norwich rival Sabelle Mardle who'd only 1/00th of a second separate them throughout the winter. Her victory was a Championship Best Performance (CBP) and a new U17 British Record. "I didn't expect to run that fast' she said.
- U20 SUCCESS EDUAN also took centre stage in the 200m. From the outset she was typically powerful and in control; had the edge on her big rival Sophie Walton and retained her U20 national title in just her first indoor competition of the season particularly commendable following a very difficult few weeks emotionally. - With over 350 athletes entered in the 60m, the strength in depth was phenomenal and FU17 THEO MAY & U15 NIAMH RIDLER benefited to record great PB's of 7.16m and 8.10 (resp.). It was also a great day for U20 FREYA DOCKERTY who produced PB's in both the 60m Hurdles heats and the final (8.66) and U15 LIAM O'BRIEN (9.38) in the heats.

SUCCESS & REYNOLD UK INDOOR CHAMPIONS

SUCCESS EDUAN and REYNOLD BANIJO won prestigious National titles at the UKA Indoor championships in Birmingham and SEUN OKOME won national silver.
